PROGRAMS & SERVICES

Centinela Valley Union High School District offers crisis intervention, suicide-related assessments, ongoing counseling and support groups, parent presentations and staff trainings at four high schools in the Centinela Valley Union High School District. (204 students served)

Elevate Youth provides wraparound services in three core areas: mental health, educational services, and youth-centered programs. Through a partnership with DaVinci RISE High School, co-located on Richstone's campus, the program empowers youth to take ownership of the quality and direction of their lives. (623 individuals served)

The Everychild Foundation Healing Center provides comprehensive trauma focused treatment, a myriad of support and educational groups, and wellness programs to both address the needs of children and families in crisis and help them build long-term resilience. (2,279 individuals served)

Kids Club After-School Program is an on site year-round program providing homework help, tutoring, social skills development, character-building and enrichment activities in a safe and nurturing environment. (50 children served)

Lennox Mathematics, Science & Technology Academy is a program through which therapeutic services are provided on campus for the students at Lennox Academy. (143 students served)

Parents as Teachers provides voluntary, bi-weekly home visitation services to high-risk families with children ages 0-5 in the South Bay, West LA, Watts, and West Athens communities. Participating families engage in case management services, resource and referral connections, parenting education, child development screenings and assessments. (106 children and parents served)

Providence Little Company of Mary is a partnership program through which Richstone provides individual, family and group therapy at a local community health clinic to promote both physical and mental health in our community. (117 individuals served)
